After six biennial conferences in the Swiss Alps, the Aeschi group is holding its third North American conference at the world-class Sonnenalp Hotel in the Colorado Rockies. The conference is organized around a series of videos illustrating key concepts in the narratives, assessment and treatment of patients at risk for suicide.
